## The City Council of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) (Cavalry Ride) Amendment 2025

The Norwich City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 32 and 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and with the consent of the Norfolk County Council in accordance with section 39(3) of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby make the following order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as The City Council of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) (Cavalry Ride) Amendment 2025 and shall come into operation for all purposes on the XX day of XXX 2025.
- 2. The City of Norwich (Residents Car Parks) Order 1996 as amended (the "1996 Order) is further amended as specified in Articles 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9.
- 3. The provisions of the Schedule to this Order are added to phase 3 of the Schedule of the 1996 Order within the section titled 'Former General Improvement Area car parks managed by Housing Services'
- 4. The plan annexed to this Order marked 'Cavalry Ride Car Park' shall be annexed to the 1996 Order
- 5. The following definitions shall be added to the 1996 Order:
  - "physical parking permit" means a parking permit issued physically on paper, card, plastic or other such suitable material as the Council may determine which is to be displayed in a vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
  - "electronic parking permit" means a parking permit issued electronically and held electronically
- 6. The following article shall be added to the 1996 Order to follow the last article in the 1996 Order:
  - The Council may issue a parking permit in either physical or electronic form at their absolute discretion.
- 7. The following article shall be added to the 1996 Order to follow the new article to be added in accordance with clause 6 of this Order
  - Where the Council has issued a physical parking permit this must be displayed in the relevant vehicle waiting in a parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 8. The following article shall be added to the 1996 Order to follow the new article to be added in accordance with clause 7 of this Order
  - Where the Council has issued an electronic parking permit only and there is no physical parking permit issued the provisions of this Order relating to the display of the parking permit in a physical form in a vehicle shall not apply and is

replaced with a requirement to hold a valid electronic parking permit for the relevant parking place provided that should the Council issue a parking permit in both electronic and physical form, the physical parking permit must still be displayed.

9. The following article shall be added to the 1996 Order to follow the new article to be added in accordance with clause 8 of this Order

Where the Council has issued an electronic parking permit the holder of the electronic parking permit shall retain any electronic documentation as evidence of eligibility to use the parking place and shall provide this to a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform on request.

10. In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
